Denver - Eisenhower Phones Shivers on victory.

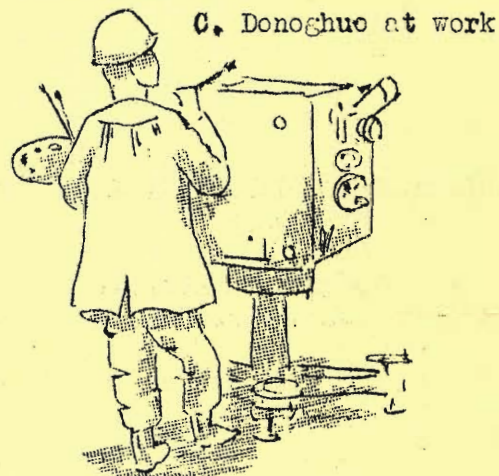
Democrats score Dewey, Congress at Upstate picnics. Roosevelt, Harriman, Balch Blane Republicans for low farm, high food prices.

Rio De Janeiro - Tie to Reds seen in Vargas Party. Suicide of Brazilian President is expected to spur, not ease, political conflict.

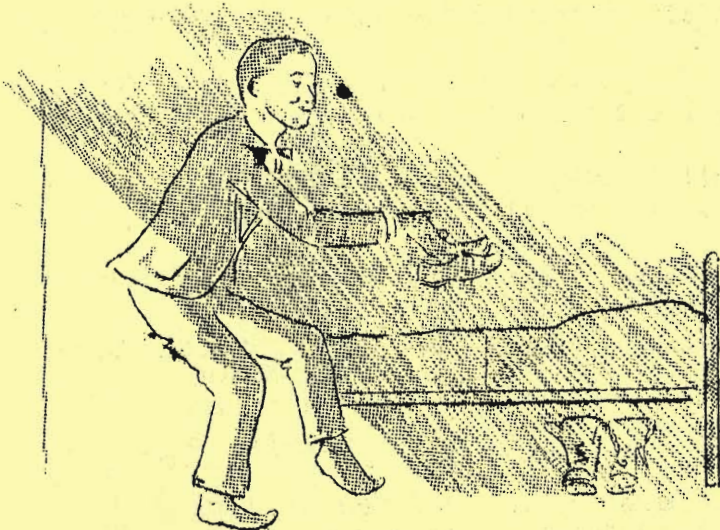
Washington - U.S. drives to win Indochina people. Information Agency widens its activities in area - Director tells of gains elsewhere.
